Three Holy Women to Inspire us

The Catholic Church sees **Mary Magdalen**, whose feast we celebrated this week, the "sinner" of Luke 7 who wiped the feet of Jesus and the sister of Martha and Lazarus as one person. She is a symbol of forgiveness. The one who is forgiven much loves much and she is privileged to be a first witness to the Resurrection. Our world has replaced morality with subjective "values" and seems unable to forgive. When we are tempted to think like that, remember the Magdalen.

Last week I venerated at the tomb of St **Monica**. Her prayers and persistence helped convert her pagan husband, Patritius. Her mother's tears and prayers played a large part in the conversion of her son. Augustine had a "partner" by whom he had a child and he fell for Manichæism which claimed to be a synthesis of all religions. Monica must have felt he was lost to her, but she persevered. She lived to see him convert and reform his way of life. In our age we seem to have lost the ability to pass on the Faith. Let's take heart from St Monica and pray to her for our children. "Our mission doesn't finish with their birth: we want also to conceive them for life eternal."

St **Bridget** of Sweden, yesterday's saint, is called the Patroness of Failures. God gave her the task of founding a new Order, but she was called to Rome before the abbey was finished. She was called to bring the Popes back from Avignon, and failed. She didn't make peace between France and England, another tough task, and she died in Rome far from home. She reminds us that Our Lord, hanging on the Cross, was a failure. Yet today, the Order she founded is flourishing and the nuns' distinctive veil can be seen in such disparate part of the world as Maryvale, Birmingham and the Piazza Farnese in Rome.
