Fear is useless; its power to control us increases as we entertain our fear. We worry about so many things in our lives; sometimes about people, events, things or even our future.

We fear, for example, about our own life, health, children, possessions, security, love life and, even worse, how we shall leave this world one day; and many others. We are also afraid of various things which threaten our peace and disturb our existence. All these, I tell you, are real and are also my concerns.

In the Gospel of today, we see that even the disciples themselves were afraid. They were apprehensive about how they were going to go about the mission of evangelisation entrusted to them by Jesus. Yes, it is true that they were promised assistance by the Master, yet the threats were so real before their eyes. Threats like hostile settings, the people they were to visit, the sects of different religions surrounding them, the various intimidations, the possible scarce reception of the Gospel message, or worse, their imminent martyrdom.

In addition to those, they were told as well that all which is concealed is to be revealed; nothing would remain hidden. In others words, all that Jesus told them must be preached boldly and openly to all, regardless of who they are. Are these matters simple to face? I do not think so. Yet Jesus told them that "fear is uselss - what is needed is trust".

Friends, just like any of us, we are assured by the Lord not to fear of anything because everything is in the hands of God. We must see in the light of faith that God attends even to the least detail of our fear. Human as we are, it is but natural to feel so. But GOD is absolutely in control of anything and everything. We only have to let him be our God in every minute of our lives; allowing his Spirit to enter our lives just as blood flows through all our veins. Amen. Fr Alex, rcj
