TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B) WEEK COMMENCING 25TH AUGUST 2024

We come to the last part of John Chapter 6. Many disciples find it extremely difficult to accept Jesus' teaching about his body and blood. And this teaching causes many to turn away, unable to grasp the spiritual truth He is offering. He is left with his disciples only. And he turns to them and asks them 'what about you, do you want to go away too?'. And Peter answered 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe, and we know that you are the only one of God.' Peter's response is an affirmation of his deep faith and trust in Jesus. A statement that came straight from his heart. Despite the difficulty of Jesus' teachings, Peter recognizes that there is no alternative to Christ. This passage invites us to reflect on our faith in the Holy Eucharist - the real presence and on some challenging truths that Jesus offers. It calls us to trust in Him, even when understanding falters.
