### TWENTY- SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) WEEK COMMENCING 25TH SEPTEMBER 2022

This weeks Gospel of Lazarus and the Rich man reminds us that poverty poses a dramatic problem of Justice. All that is needed for evil to triumph is for good men to do nothing, nothing to recognise the equal rights of all people to take their place at the table of the common banquet. In today's Gospel Lazarus represents the family struggling to pay their energy bills and put food on their table, the elderly person with no one to visit them, or the young person who lacks the opportunities to fulfil their potential. The Church's social doctrine is both a judge and defender of unrecognised and violated rights for the poor the weak and the least. The Rich man in the Gospel was completely unaware of Lazarus in life and ended up suffering miserably in eternity. Justice will be done in the end however, we have the opportunity and the obligation to ensure that justice is done now and that people are seated at the common banquet table of the Lord in every sense. The World energy council recently said "a radical generosity is needed to prevent lives being lost because of soaring gas and electricity bills this winter" This is not just true of the lives now but the well being of our souls in eternity.
