Day For The Unemployed
Week Commencing 27th February 2022

Amongst other things, the outbreak of war turns my mind to our mortality. Meditating on death can sharpen our focus on life. What is its purpose and ultimate goal? In today's second reading St Paul gives us beautiful words of Christian faith and hope; "Death has been swallowed up in victory ...it has lost its sting." Though we are saddened by the certainty of dying, we must be buoyed up and built up in the sure and certain hope of the resurrection. By responding to God's grace in this life, we shall live forever with him in the next. This week I had the privilege of celebrating a funeral mass for a lovely mother of 6. After a short struggle with terminal cancer, she peacefully died in her home surrounded by a faith-filled family praying the rosary. This mother had a living faith and journeyed through death with serenity towards eternal life. Death cannot snatch those who have already given themselves over to God. Death cannot kill those who in faith have died to themselves. With Lent around the corner, we are once more invited to truly consider if we are given to God and dead to self? Through the simple practice of prayer, alms giving and fasting, we can give ourselves back to God to live with him now and for all eternity. In such unprecedented times around us, we must remain rooted in the resurrection, courageous in carrying the cross with a living hope of receiving the crown of unfading glory.
