Fr Alex writes:

Our dear parishioners, maybe you have already noticed and wondered about the three additional letters after my name: "RCJ". This is actually the abbreviation of the Latin words Rogationistarum Cordis Jesu (Rogationists of the Heart of Jesus), the name of the religious Congregation where I belong.

This is in the same way that our Lord, Bishop Alan Williams, adds "SM" after his name, which indicates his belongingness to the Order of the Society of Mary. Other examples are the Jesuits who have "SJ", the Dominicans "OP", the Franciscans "OFM" and so on and so forth. By the way, every religious institution/congregation that exists in the church has its own distinctive mark so that one can be differentiated from others. But, beyond the mere purpose of distinction, each represents a particular "charism", a gift to be shared for the common good of the entire Church. As one spiritual author rightly said: The different religious congregations in the Church are like different varieties of flowers that make up a beautiful garden.

So, "RCJ" represents our name Rogationists that takes its root from the Latin verb rogate, which means "pray". Let me further explain: This does not simply refer to any prayer whatsoever, but it is a special prayer commanded by Jesus himself as narrated in the Gospels: Jesus went through all the towns and villages. teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had

compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Therefore, PRAY (**rogate**) the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into his harvest field" (Mt 9:35-39; Lk 10:2)

For us *Rogationists*, the **ROGATE** is our unique identity and particular commitment in the Church and in the world. In imitation of Jesus Christ the Good Shepherd, we strive to be *men of prayer and compassion* to the "harassed and helpless crowds" of today. In order to obey this specific command of Jesus, we dedicate ourselves to pray and invite others to do the same so that the Lord will send holy vocations in the Church, to the priesthood, to consecrated life and to the lay state. Yet, our prayer must be accompanied by compassion, i.e., concrete acts of charity, especially to the little ones and the poor. Meanwhile, we are fully aware that while we pray for holy workers, we should strive, first of all, to be holy ourselves, to be good workers in the vast vineyard of the Church.

However, the ROGATE or PRAY is a command of Jesus that is addressed not only to us Rogationists but, to everybody. As our holy Father Founder, St. Hannibal Mary Di Francia, used to say: "vocations come from above!" So, we all need to pray.....otherwise vocations will not come! We must pray so that the Lord of the harvest will send us holy priests, holy consecrated men and women, holy parents, holy leaders...

Lastly therefore, allow me to share to you our simple prayer: **SEND**, **O LORD**, **HOLY APOSTLES INTO YOUR CHURCH!** I invite you to repeat this prayer at the conclusion of your group prayer, every mystery of the rosary – after the Fatima prayer, as well as during grace before and after meals.
