Psalm Sunday marks the End of lent and the beginning of Holy Week. Jesus enters triumphantly in to Jerusalem and the air is filled with songs and an atmosphere of joy. Just a few days later the same crowds that were hailing Hosanna are crying crucify him. Perhaps the sudden change of events mirrors what we experienced this time last year, going from normality to lockdown in the space of a few short days. From pubs, parks and cinemas to the now mundane four walls of our homes. Sudden change can be hard, it can also be an opportunity to grow. C.S Lewis beautifully states that "Mere change is not growth. Growth is the synthesis of change and continuity, and where there is no continuity there is no growth". Holy week, the central week of the Churches life celebrates the Paschal Mysteries of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection. My prayer for this Holy week is that as a parish we take our confusion, brokenness, anxiety and difficulties to the constant well spring of God's love in the liturgy. - No mingling with other people you do not live with after Mass outside the Church.

Anyone displaying symptoms of Covid-19, or who has reason to believe that they have been in contact with someone who has, should not attend church or volunteer in any capacity until they have received medical advice that it is safe to do so.

- Good Friday Office of Readings and Morning Prayer at 10_{am}; with the Good Friday Liturgy at 1_{pm} and 3_{pm}; Children's Stations of the Cross at 11.15_{am}
- Holy Saturday Office of Readings and Morning Prayer at 10_{am}; The Easter Vigil will begin at 8_{pm} and will celebrated as normal except that there will be no service of light, fewer readings and no baptisms/receptions.
