Whether we guessed correctly the sex of the royal baby, or put money on the name the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge would choose, we can all thank God for the safe arrival of the future George VII. It is fortuitous that the annual Day for Life falls today, on the Sunday following this news. Nothing epitomises the precious vulnerability of life more positively than a new-born child. After weeks of bad news for the pro-life movement, it is good to see the natural excitement and iov on the faces of those of different faiths and none who have entered into the festive spirit of the royal birth. Whether they recognise it or not, this is part of the "culture of life" which the Bishops of England and Wales promote this year with the leaflet "Care for Life: It's Worth it!" Please take one as you leave Mass. It opposes the utilitarian approach to human life summed up by our Holy Father Francis: "this elderly man, this elderly woman is useless; discard them like we hang up (our) raincoat during the summer ... because they're now disposable, they're useless." It's not all bad news! A London abortion "clinic" has recently closed down and the Liverpool Care Pathway has been abolished following the report by the Independent Review. In Rio, Pope Francis has turned the spotlight on a "favela", a slum, so emphasising that the poor and marginalised have a right to life too. The bishops in their leaflet assert that the culture of life "embraces a love that inspires self-giving. It is a love that allows us to see in every person another self

and compels us to protect and care for that person as we would our very selves."

They have areas of particular concern at this time: protecting the unborn and their

mothers with practical, emotional and spiritual support; encouraging the culture of

life in society, specifically in law-making and medical practice; promoting the Sacrament of Reconciliation for those involved in abortion. Let's ask God how we can play our part in promoting those worthy aims.
