# SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B) WEEK COMMENCING 28<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2024

We begin this Sunday a journey through John ch.6, five consecutive Sundays take us through the chapter. It is clearly devoted to teaching on the Eucharist, for those whose minds are not closed by prejudice. We may note there are only two 'food miracles' in John, Cana for water changed into an abundance of wine and here 5 loaves multiplied into an abundance food, bread and wine, the elements for the Eucharist. Philip's question to Jesus reminds us of Moses' question to God during the Exodus, where can enough food be found for the multitude; God's response in both cases goes beyond nature. (so in a way Philip failed the test, could he not have put everything into Jesus' hands?) Much more could be said but just one comment about the setting and especially, 'plenty of grass'. The implication is there is good pasture (echoes of The Lord is My Shepherd), so the crowd are not just a random assembly but represent the lost sheep of the House of Israel.
