"London Weeps!" You can't really imagine this as a poster slogan put out by the mayor and council of our capital. But the equivalent, "Roma Piange", was to be seen all around the eternal city when John Paul II died. During those incredible days which followed the 2nd of April 2005, when Rome seemed instantly packed with pilgrims from every corner of the globe, we often heard the chant or saw the banner "Santo Subito" – calling for his canonisation immediately. You might well call it popular acclamation, the way early saints were declared. Here we are, eight years on, ready to see that call realised under his successor Pope Francis. To mark his canonisation in the parish we will be giving seven monthly multi-media talks in the crypt spanning different aspects of his huge contribution to the Church founded by Jesus Christ. These will be on Sunday afternoons, details to follow.

"If God created shadows, it was to better emphasize the light." This quotation of John XXIII sums up the positive spirit of "Good Pope John". He is of course most famous for calling the Second Vatican Council. In his opening address he said: "...the Church should never depart from the sacred treasure of truth inherited from the Fathers. But at the same time she must ever look to the present, to the new conditions and the new forms of life introduced into the modern world." With both Popes scheduled for canonisation we will again watch history in the making. Rome will rejoice! And so will all loyal sons and daughters of the Church.

We are also awaiting the launch of a new course designed for those who know nothing about the Church or the Faith. It's DVD based and we will run it in the crypt. It's called the "Why?" course and each episode will be repeated three times a week starting next month. Now is the time to begin thinking about

whom you will invite. When you have made your list, start praying for them. Then when the details are announced, and you suggest to them that they might like to come, the ground will be properly prepared. What a reproach it would be if, for lack of your encouragement, you reached heaven and your best friend did not! Watch out for the posters with more details. Fr Neil Brett
