The man serving me in the coffee shop in Rome frowned at me when I asked for a coffee *porta via*, literally to takeaway. In Italy, a small coffee is usually drunk very quickly (often in seconds) rather than taken out, and standing at the counter, *al banco*, rather than sitting down to chat with friends or colleagues. The tradition in Italy is to have a long lunch with friends or a drink and a snack after work - the *aperitivo* as it is known. It is a way to take some time out and relax.

Different cultures relax in different ways: my mother is from Yorkshire and we have always brewed a pot of tea at times during the day, everyone in the family gravitating to the kitchen to spend time and talk. I guess that most of us have some way of taking a break at work and at home which involves a comforting hot drink where we can stop and refresh ourselves. These moments can be an excellent time to spend a few minutes with God. If we are struggling to fit in some prayer each day then the time it takes to boil a kettle and brew a pot of tea or coffee can be time to pray a decade of the rosary, or talk with Jesus. We could also keep a bible or prayer book in the kitchen and pray a psalm whilst the tea leaves are brewing.

Tea breaks and time relaxing with a coffee are often shared between friends, precious times to chat and waste time together; so why not include the Lord, our best friend, in our tea breaks as well?
