In the second reading, St.Paul is giving the Church one example of the importance of Tradition. It's all very well saying that Christians should follow Scripture alone, as Protestants do, but such a position is impossible of fulfilment. Many people talk about, 'The Bible' as if it has no origin and no setting. What we call the Old Testament was a selection, by the people/authorities of that time, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit (unbeknownst to them) of what God wished to be authoritative, a standard. Much else was written in Old Testament times, yet it is not recognised as part of Scripture, in other words, the people/authorities did not see in it what they knew to be true about themselves and their relationship with God. This process of discernment continued into the Apostolic times. There were many groups around in the early years after Jesus' death and Resurrection, all claiming to preach the truth about him and particularly how his followers should live. What we call the New Testament was selected by one of those groups because they recognised in what was written, the message they preached, the preaching and practice came first, the written word came later. That particular group is what we call the early Church and it chose the content of the New Testament, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We, as the Catholic Church, claim to be the direct continuation of that early Church, faithful to the teaching and practice of the Apostles. Ever since Apostolic times, any group which has claimed the name, 'Christian', ought to be able to demonstrate that there is unbroken continuity in its message, from earliest days to their own times; if this can't be done, then the message they preach is not the message of St.Paul and the other Apostles.
