### FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (A) WEEK COMMENCING 29TH NOVEMBER 2020



In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus mentions a doorkeeper as someone who needs to stay alert, awake. It reminded me of the Roman 'god', Janus, who was supposed to guard doors etc. (Please note, I am not in any way suggesting that such a god existed, just referring to the idea of the story). He was portrayed with two faces, so he could cover front and back doors at the same time. Jesus exhorts us, rather forcefully, to 'Stay awake'. Coming at this time of the church's year, we can take it as a reminder to 'look both ways', not just now but always, awake and watchful. What do I mean by 'look both ways'? Looking back is to bring under review where we have come from, past choices we've made etc., which help us understand who we are now, both good and bad aspects. Looking forward is to call to mind God's promises and stir up our desire to receive what is promised. Putting the two together we come to the present, awake and alert, actively seeking to put God's will into practice in our daily lives, to deepen our conversion of heart. If we are not doing that, we shall be sleepwalking through life, apparently awake but with unseeing eyes. This season is instead very much a time to be wide awake.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It is good that we are able to reopen our churches for Mass. However, I am increasingly conscious of the situation of St. Joseph's at Mile End. It is of such a shape that very few could attend Mass and so it has not been reopened, given the pressure on church space with distancing guidelines etc. I appreciate that the regulars there may be missing their 9.15 Sunday Mass, I would be, and hope that you are not feeling aggrieved. All being well, we shall be able to resume normal services some time next year.

Due to the latest Government restrictions, we are currently not able to gather for public worship from 5<sup>th</sup> November to 2<sup>nd</sup> December. During this time, Fr. Paschal and I will continue to celebrate Mass separately each day at 8.15<sub>am</sub> without a congregation; Mass intentions will be published for each Mass in the weekly newsletter. The Church will open daily (Mon-Sun) from 10.00<sub>am</sub> to 11.00<sub>am</sub> for individual prayer and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. From Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> December, we will once again be able to celebrate public mass from 10am. Please see Mass Schedule for week's masses. Thank you to all our volunteer Stewards, as without you this would not be possible. *Fr. Chris* 

Please note the following norms which remain in place in order to promote a COVID 19 safe environment:-

- Churches will open 15 minutes before start of Private Prayer & Mass (from 03/12/20)
- Entrance to Church will be via the main door, exit by the side door
- Hand sanitiser is available at entrance and exit, though you may bring your own
- It will be essential that people sit where they are asked and do not move from there
- The use of face covering/mask in Church is now mandatory (please don't forget yours when attending Church) and that you wear it so that it covers both your mouth and nose.
- Social distancing must be maintained at all times within Church.
- An Offertory Collection box will be situated at entrance and exit; the donation station is also useable
- No touching of Statues or Images in Church
- Toilets will be closed except for genuine emergencies.
- We are still required to have Church stewards daily for private prayer and the church will be cleaned in readiness for the next morning.

Anyone displaying symptoms of Covid-19, or who has reason to believe that they have been in contact with someone who has, should not attend church or volunteer in any capacity until they have received medical advice that it is safe to do so.
