In this Sundays Gospel, we have a great image of Jesus slipping unharmed through the crowds; he lives to preach another day. Jesus does not avoid the hatred of the hard-hearted on the contrary; he seems to confront the issues head on. In this gospel scene, he does so by exposing the hearts of the people from his hometown. In a similar way, life can often present us with many difficulties. Whilst the temptation to avoid difficulties by distraction or evasion can seem like the most natural thing to do, avoiding the road is also to avoid the destination. Today's readings steer our hearts back towards our greatest goal and our ultimate destination; the complete and perfect possession of unending life in heaven, union with God. The life and ministry of Jesus continues to teach us that the journey to perfect love and union with God must go through the difficult road of selfless sacrificial love. Jesus chose to save us from our sins by confronting sin head on. He did not dodge the bullet but when the time came, he pulled the weed of sin out from its root, crushing the head of the devil by his passion, death and resurrection. He went through to get to. The same will be required of us. True charity will ask that we give everything. That giving everything begins with receiving everything God freely gives. Most beautifully in the gift of Holy Communion, a gift that many young people in our Parish will receive for the first time this weekend.
