World Day of Prayer for Vocations

Week Commencing 30th April 2023

On the fourth Sunday of Easter we think of the Resurrected Christ as our good Shepherd and typically we pray for vocations asking God to send more Shepherds to care for his flock. Christ is the ultimate Shepherd and guardian of our souls, the Pope is his vicar, Bishops and priests exercise ministry in his name and with his authority. Sometimes some people perceive the Church as imposing limits and restrictions on human freedom. Why does the Church not bless same sex couples, allow abortion and euthanasia many ask. The image of a shepherd reminds us that all of the teaching and practice of the Church are to keep the faithful safe, in reality it is not the laws of the church but sin that enslaves constricts and limits our freedom. God wants to lead us to graze in the green pastures of his friendship. Here our hearts find true rest, peace and joy. It is for this reason the Bishop as the chief Shepherd in a Diocese is given a crosier at his ordination with the following words; "Take this staff as a sign of your pastoral office: keep watch over the whole flock in which the Holy Spirit has appointed you to shepherd the Church of God." The Rod to fight off the attack of the enemy and a hook shaped top symbolising how he gathers the flock. Let us pray for Bishop Alan and pray for more men to become priests, faithful and good Shepherds.
