THE MOST HOLY TRINITY (B)

Week Commencing 30th May 2021



Central to our Catholic faith is belief in the Trinity, that is, we believe in three Persons – Father, Son, Spirit – in one God. This truth was revealed to mankind by Jesus in his public ministry. Some people shy away from this teaching, because they don't understand it and remain unconvinced until such time as they do understand it (which won't happen). I'd suggest this is curious. Much of what we do every day involves using things we don't understand e.g. a smartphone, the lack of understanding doesn't stop us from using them. In a somewhat similar way, we are invited to 'use' the teaching on the Trinity. In other words, we are called to share the life of the Trinity, by God. In this world our sharing is imperfect; for those found worthy of a place in heaven, the Beatific Vision will answer any misgivings we may have as we experience the Trinity. The key to all this, of course, is charity, divine love, both here and in the world to come.

THE POPE'S INTENTIONS FOR JUNE: The Beauty of Marriage. Let us pray for young people who are preparing for marriage with the support of a Christian community: may they grow in love, with generosity, faithfulness and patience.

The intimacy of married love has this high calling: wholly love God and love each other, we are one another's closest neighbour. It is said that married love most closely reveals the love relationships in the Trinity: three persons in one God, calls us to be two persons in one flesh.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Despite all the restrictions, let us be thankful that we can once again gather together, despite social distancing, as God's people. Please note the following norms which remain in place in order to promote a COVID 19 safe environment:-

- Churches will open 15 minutes before start of Mass
- Facemasks must be worn when entering all places of worship (unless medically exempt)
- Entrance to Church will be via the main door, exit by the side door
- Hand sanitiser is available at entrance and exit, though you may bring your own
- It will be essential that people sit where they are asked and do not move from there

- Social distancing must be maintained at all times within Church.

- We are still required to have Church Stewards in attendance at each Mass and the Church will be cleaned after each Service in readiness for the next Mass to be held.
- No mingling with other people you do not live with after Mass outside the Church.

Anyone displaying symptoms of Covid-19, or who has reason to believe that they have been in contact with someone who has, should not attend church or volunteer in any capacity until they have received medical advice that it is safe to do so.
