The first reading for this week begins with a wonderful and realistic statement from the book of Ecclesiastes. "Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" This is a cry of the preacher against those whose lives revolve around meaningless goals. This is typically based on the Old Testament background, where people were attracted by all sorts of idol worships and pagan gods. Slowly they began to drift away from the one Holy God who looked after them and protected them all through their life. Whenever Hs people go away, God intervenes in their life through ways unknown to man.

In today's Gospel Jesus tries to remind us to have the right focus on life. Through the parable of the rich farmer who was blessed with an abundant harvest Jesus reminds us that man's ways are often different from that of God's. We are often focused more on things of this world. Our priorities often move around getting rich, securing a comfortable life, enjoying all the pleasures that this world can offer. But, just like the rich farmer, we often fail to look for those things which can fix our focus on God. We are too busy fixing all the necessary things for the worldly life, in the course of which, storing up treasures in heaven is comfortably ignored. We have time for weekend celebrations, we have time for friends, we have time for work, we have time for entertainment (move into any public place and you will wonder upon people moving around busy with their mobile phones, they are busy with their Pokemon, having no concern for the people next to them), we have time for anything and everything, but when it comes to the matter of thanking the Lord for all these gifts that he gave us, we have no time for Mass, we have no time for prayer. Today God invites us to have a deep reflection of our priorities and reminds us of the need to rearrange and re-focus our priorities. After all it is Him who has got an ultimate control on our life, more than ourselves. Our ambitions and riches will have to be left behind if God will otherwise for us. So let us be thankful to the Lord for all the blessings in our life and realise the fact that everything we have comes from Him.
