

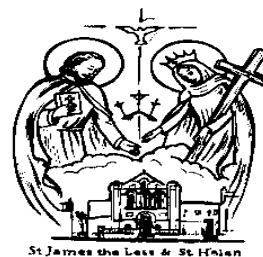

**NEXT DIOCESAN 2<sup>nd</sup> COLLECTION:** There will be a 2<sup>nd</sup> collection for World Day of the Poor on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2021.
