God is eternal not subject to time, whereas mankind is presently very much in time. At Christmas we celebrate the Word made flesh, the moment when God enters into this world of time. It is instructive to reflect on how Jesus interacts with time. In the first place, his birth was at the right time, in God's plans; Bethlehem nearly 2,000 years ago wasn't accidental. We don't know exactly how old Jesus was when he died on the Cross, which strikes us with our obsession with time as odd; perhaps something to learn there? We do know that the majority of Jesus' time on earth was spent in obscurity, which is again a contrast with our culture of public 'stars'. Those silent years in Nazareth, we can infer, were passed as a member of a family and engaged in routine, humdrum daily life. God seems to be telling us that it is precisely in the ordinary that we can become most ourselves, interacting with other family members and friends in a simple way. We can also note that it would have been St.Joseph he would first have called, 'Abba'; who would have taught him to be a skilled craftsman; taken him to the synagogue, etc. Fr.Chris
